Curriculum Feedback from Alumni


Since the academic year 2018-2019, the Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has annually conducted a curriculum survey involving the Alumni of UG and PG students of the Institution. This survey comprises 10 questions aimed at evaluating curriculum quality and delivery. Sample feedback is collected using a Five Point Scale.

Feedback Analysis

- 1. Adequateness of the courses offered in the programme. A vast majority (86%) of respondents rated the adequateness of the courses as excellent. Nearly all feedback is positive, indicating strong satisfaction with the courses offered.
- 2. Efficiency of the syllabus enabling you to face other aspects of life: The syllabus is perceived as highly efficient, with 82% rating it as excellent. Combined with the very good and good ratings, this suggests the syllabus is well-regarded in preparing students for various life aspects.
- 3. Relevance of the curriculum in relation to your current professional life: Most respondents find the curriculum relevant to their professional life, with 81% rating it as excellent. The feedback is predominantly positive, though slightly less so than the previous aspects.
- 4. **Skills acquired from the curriculum for practical exposure in life**: The curriculum is viewed as effective in imparting practical skills, with 84% rating it as excellent. There is a minor presence of less positive feedback, but overall satisfaction remains high.
- 5. Choice of electives in providing competence in employability skills, communicative, and soft skills: The elective courses are considered to provide valuable employability and soft skills, with 81% rating this aspect as excellent. There is a small percentage of lower ratings, indicating some room for improvement.
- 6. Design of the syllabus prescribed provides room for self-learning: The syllabus design is appreciated for encouraging self-learning, with 80% giving it an excellent rating. The positive feedback is strong, suggesting the curriculum supports independent learning well.
- Competence and support offered by the institution for the overall development of the students: The institution is highly regarded for its competence and support, with 82% rating this aspect as excellent. A small number of poor ratings suggest a need to address some concerns.
- 8. Curriculum enhances various co-curricular activities: The curriculum is seen as enhancing co-curricular activities effectively, with 85% giving it an excellent rating. The feedback is overwhelmingly positive, indicating strong support for co-curricular development.
- 9. Whether syllabus helps you to motivate towards research: The syllabus is generally motivating for research, with 81% rating it as excellent. There is, however, a notable proportion (8%) who rated it as good, implying some variability in how motivating the syllabus is for research.



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
