General Observations:

- 1. The college is located in the scenic Madayippara area and managed by Payyanur Cooperative Educational Society.
- Adequate land is available for future infrastructure development.
 The college is undergoing its 2nd cycle of NAAC accreditation

- 4. The college maintains an active IQAC.5. It offers 6 UG and 2 PG courses, alongside diploma, certificate, and add-on courses also were offered.
- 6. Over the last 5 years, it has introduced 39 diploma/certificate and add-on courses.
- 7. Limited financial support has been received from government and non-government bodies in the past 7 years.
- 8. Faculty strength includes 34 members, with 11 holding Ph.Ds, and there are 8 nonteaching staff members.
- The campus is equipped with Wi-fi facility
- 10. It has 28 active MOUs/collaborations.
- 11. The college library is well-facilitated to support academic needs.

- Establish effective monitoring mechanisms across the college under the guidance of IQAC.

Teaching Learning and Evaluation:

- Provide enhanced support to teaching staff to attend academic sessions for improving academic excellence.
