
Curriculum Feedback from Parents


Since the academic year 2019-2020, the Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has annually conducted a curriculum survey involving the parents of UG and PG students of the Institution. This survey comprises 11 questions aimed at evaluating curriculum quality and delivery. Sample feedback is collected using a Five Point Scale.




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
The Graphical Result of Curriculum Survey on parents











Feedback Analysis

- 1. Do you think the curriculum workload is affordable by your ward: The majority of respondents (86%) strongly agree that the curriculum workload is affordable for their ward. Combined with those who agree (10%), this suggests a very high level of satisfaction (96%) with the curriculum workload's affordability. Only a small fraction (4%) is neutral, and there are no disagreements.
- 2. Rate accessibility of content/reference books: Accessibility of content and reference books is rated very positively, with 86% strongly agreeing and 10% agreeing, making up a total of 96% positive responses. However, 2% are neutral, and 2% disagree, indicating a small area for improvement in accessibility.
- 3. Rate the advantages your ward has got from the course: A high percentage (84%) of respondents strongly agrees that their ward has gained significant advantages from the course. Including those who agree (15%), 99% of the feedback is positive. Only a small portion (1%) is neutral, with no negative responses, indicating a strong perception of benefits from the course.

- 4. Rate the change of your ward after fulfillment of the course: The change observed in the wards after completing the course is predominantly positive, with 85% strongly agreeing and 13% agreeing (98% positive responses). Only 1% remain neutral and another 1% disagree, suggesting that while the overall impact is seen as positive, there might be a minor fraction of respondents who did not observe significant changes.
- 5. Do the courses in educational modules advance business entrepreneurs and stimulate students to initiate start-ups: There is a strong positive response regarding the courses' effectiveness in advancing business entrepreneurship and stimulating start-up initiatives, with 81% strongly agreeing and 11% agreeing, totaling 92% positive responses. However, 8% are neutral, indicating that while the majority see the courses as effective in promoting entrepreneurship, a small portion of respondents are unsure about their impact.

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
