


#### **Curriculum Feedback from Students**




















#### Graphical Result of the feedback from Students








# 6. Regular updating of the syllabus to meet their needs

#### **Feedback Analysis**

- 1. **Curriculum Enhancement:** The vast majority (87%) highly agree that the curriculum enhances students' competencies, indicating strong confidence in the effectiveness of the curriculum in improving student skills.
- 2. **Appropriateness of Syllabus and Teaching Methods:** A high percentage (89%) agree that the syllabus and teaching methods are appropriate to students' requirements, suggesting that the curriculum is well-aligned with the needs of the learners.
- 3. **Inclusion of Employability and Soft Skills:** A significant majority (83%) believe that the syllabus includes provisions for employability skills and soft skills, indicating recognition of the importance of holistic skill development.
- 4. **Relevance and Appropriateness of Units:** Most respondents (83%) agree that the units prescribed in the curriculum are relevant and appropriate, indicating satisfaction with the content selection.
- Credit Allocation: While a majority (81%) agree with the appropriate allocation of credits to the courses, a notable proportion (19%) either moderately agree or disagree, suggesting some variability in opinions regarding credit distribution.

- 6. **Regular Syllabus Updating:** A majority (82%) agree that the syllabus is regularly updated to meet the needs of the students, demonstrating responsiveness to evolving educational requirements.
- 7. **Syllabus Load:** A majority (80%) agree that the size of the syllabus is manageable in terms of the load on the students, suggesting a balance between rigor and feasibility.
- 8. **Evaluation Scheme:** The vast majority (88%) believe that an appropriate evaluation scheme is designed for each course, indicating confidence in the assessment methods employed.
- 9. **Course Objectives:** Most respondents (85%) agree that there are appropriate course objectives or program objectives in place, suggesting clarity of purpose within the curriculum.
- 10. Institutional Process for Implementation: While a majority (81%) believe there is a better institutional process for curriculum implementation, there is a notable proportion (19%) who either moderately agree or disagree, indicating some room for improvement in institutional procedures.
- 11. **Syllabus Enhancement:** While a majority (83%) agree that the syllabus provides constructive suggestions for curriculum enhancement, there is a small percentage (7%) who either moderately disagree or strongly disagree, suggesting that some respondents may feel that there's room for improvement in this aspect.
