
Curriculum Feedback from Parents



This survey comprises 11 questions aimed at evaluating curriculum quality and delivery. Sample feedback is collected using a Five Point Scale.




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
Graphical Result of the feedback from the parents











Feedback Analysis

1. Do you think the curriculum workload is affordable by your ward?

The majority of respondents (83%) strongly agree that the curriculum workload is affordable for their ward. Combined with those who agree (14%), this suggests a high level of satisfaction (97%) with the curriculum workload's affordability. Only a small fraction (3%) is neutral, and there are no disagreements.

2. Rate accessibility of content/reference books:

Accessibility of content and reference books is rated very positively, with 82% strongly agreeing and 16% agreeing, making up a total of 98% positive responses. This indicates that the resources provided are easily accessible. A minimal 2% are neutral, and there are no negative responses.

3. Rate the advantages your ward has got from the course:

A high percentage (80%) of respondents strongly agree that their ward has gained significant advantages from the course. Including those who agree (15%), 95% of the feedback is positive. Only a small portion (5%) is neutral, with no negative responses.

4. Rate the change of your ward after fulfilment of the course:

The change observed in the wards after completing the course is overwhelmingly positive, with 88% strongly agreeing and 10% agreeing (98% positive responses). Only 2% remain neutral, indicating that the course has a significant positive impact on students.

5. Do the courses in educational modules advance business entrepreneurs and stimulate students to initiate start-ups:

There is a strong positive response regarding the courses' effectiveness in advancing business entrepreneurship and stimulating start-up initiatives, with 84% strongly agreeing and 15% agreeing, total 99% positive responses. Only 1% are neutral, showing that the courses are highly effective in encouraging entrepreneurial activities among students.
