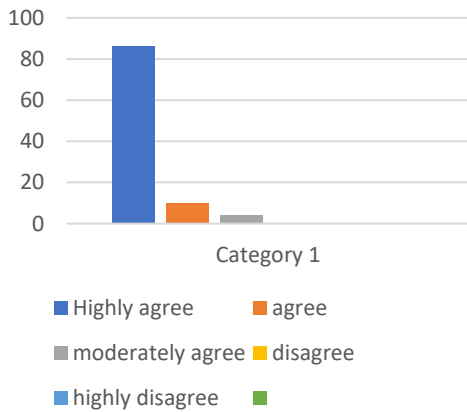

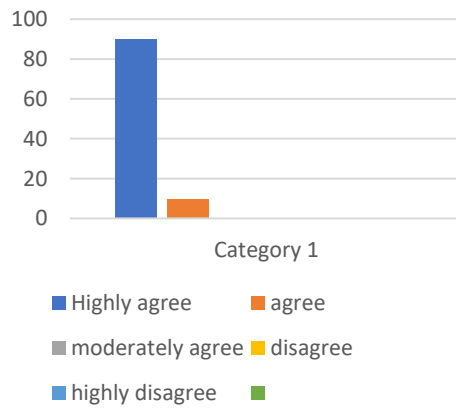

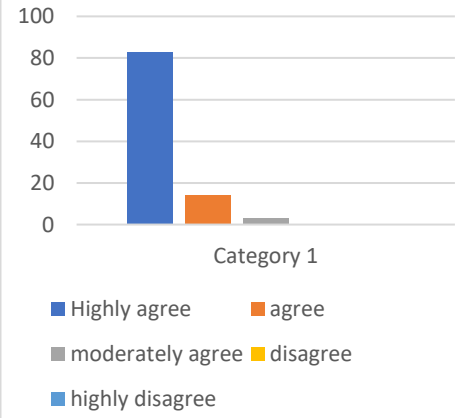
### 1. The curriculum Enhances Competencies of the Students



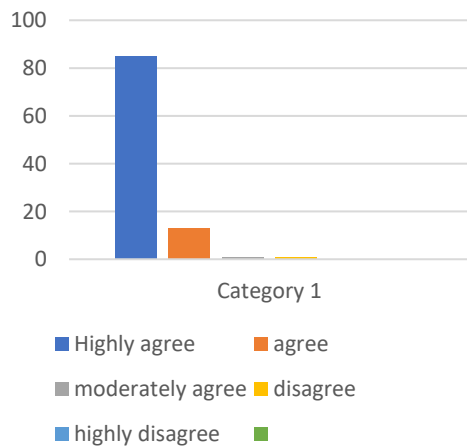
### 2. Syllabus and teaching methods were appropriate to Students Requirement



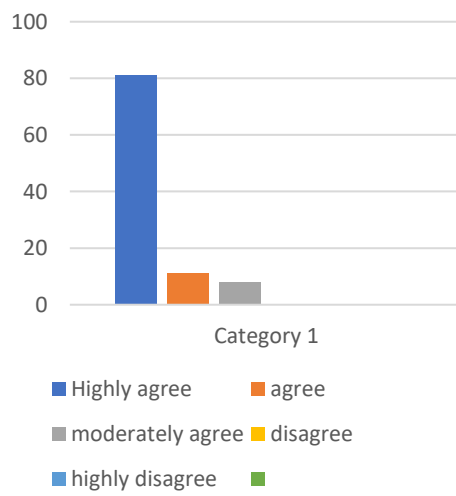
### 3. Syllabus includes Provision for employability skills and soft skills



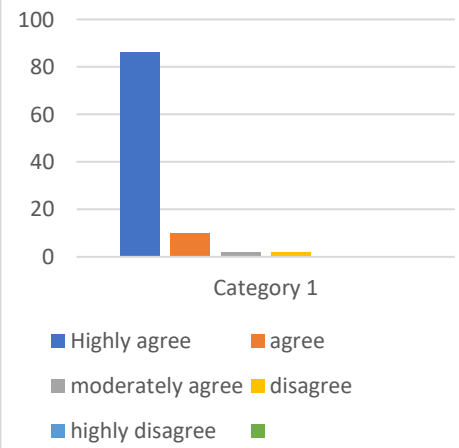

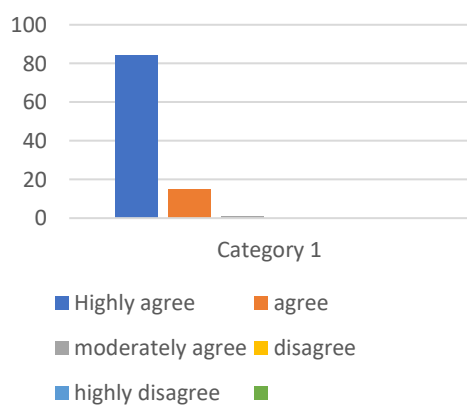

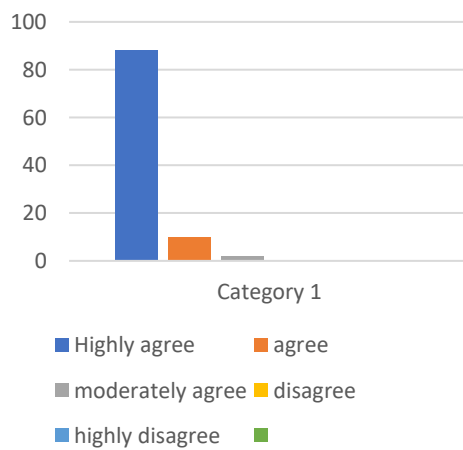

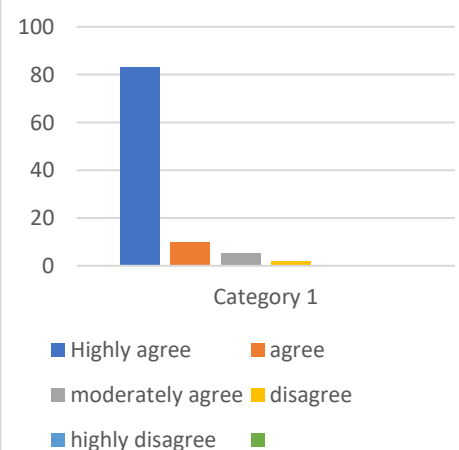

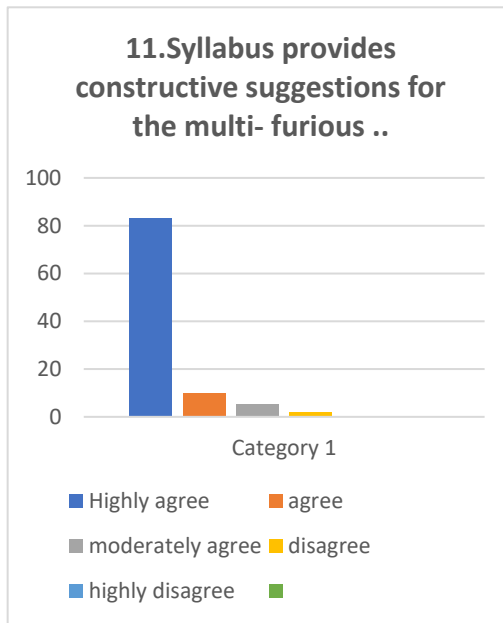

## Feedback Analysis

1. **The curriculum enhances competencies of the students:** The curriculum is highly effective in enhancing student competencies, with 86% of respondents strongly agreeing. The absence of negative responses indicates universal satisfaction.
2. **Syllabus and teaching methods were appropriate to students' requirements:** The teaching methods and syllabus are considered very appropriate for students' needs, with 90% strongly agreeing. No negative feedback highlights a perfect alignment with student requirements.
3. **Syllabus includes provision for employability skills and soft skills:** The syllabus effectively includes provisions for employability and soft skills, with 83% of respondents highly agreeing. The feedback is overwhelmingly positive.
4. **Relevance and appropriateness of the units prescribed in the curriculum:** The units prescribed in the curriculum are seen as relevant and appropriate by most respondents, with 85% strongly agreeing. The presence of a single negative response suggests very minor concerns.
5. **Appropriate allocation of credits to the courses:** The allocation of credits is considered appropriate, with 81% strongly agreeing. However, there is a notable percentage (8%) who moderately agree, indicating some room for improvement.

6. **Regular updating of the syllabus to meet their needs:** Syllabus is regularly updated to meet student needs, with 86% strongly agreeing. The presence of some disagreement suggests that while updates are generally satisfactory, occasional issues may arise.
7. **The size of the syllabus in terms of load on the students:** The syllabus size is appropriate concerning student load, with 84% strongly agreeing. Feedback is overwhelmingly positive with minimal concerns.
8. **Appropriate evaluation scheme designed for each course:** The evaluation scheme for each course is deemed appropriate, with 88% strongly agreeing. This criterion received very positive feedback with minimal concerns.
9. **Appropriate course objective or programme objective:** The course and program objectives are considered appropriate by most respondents, with 83% strongly agreeing. However, the presence of some disagreement suggests room for improvement.
10. **Better institutional process for implementation of the curriculum:** The institutional process for curriculum implementation is seen as effective, with 83% strongly agreeing. The feedback is predominantly positive with some moderate agreement.
11. **Syllabus provides constructive suggestions for the multifarious enhancement of the curriculum:** The syllabus is viewed as providing constructive suggestions for curriculum enhancement, with 83% strongly agreeing. However, the presence of some disagreement indicates room for improvement.
